1. The Cambridge Clinic website <u>www.cambridgeclinic.co.nz</u> will give you an idea about the work that we do.

Trainees in sexual assault medicine come from a variety of clinical backgrounds. This includes general practice, emergency medicine, sexual health, family planning and reproductive health and gynaecology. Prior post-graduate experience of independent case-management is required, as well as knowledge of genital anatomy, common health conditions and prescribed medications.

- 3. Please email us your CV, cover letter and contact details of 2 referees (office@cambridgeclinic.co.nz)
- 4. You may be required to attend a job interview at the Cambridge Clinic.
- 5. Once successful we will provide you with:
 - Dates, a draft programme and an Expression of Interest form for the next MEDSAC Medical/Forensic Management of Adult Sexual Assault course www.medsac.org.nz
 - Dates for upcoming peer review meetings

Process following offer of employment at the Cambridge Clinic

- 1. Sit in and observe at least one case prior to attending training (Unpaid)
- 2. Attend Cambridge Clinic peer review meetings held 4-6 times a year.
- 3. Attend the 3 day MEDSAC Medical/Forensic Management of Adult Sexual Assault course in Auckland, held annually. (Course fees, travel and accommodation costs will be covered)
- 4. Join MEDSAC as an associate member. (Membership fees will be covered)
- 5. Sit in and observe two cases (Paid)
- 6. Perform two cases with supervision. (Paid) (More supervision may be required at the discretion of the supervisor and/or trainee)
- 7. Go onto the Cambridge Clinic roster. Phone support will be available following the initial training period.
- 8. Work towards MEDSAC accreditation and become a MEDSAC Doctor.
- 9. Maintain MEDSAC accreditation.
